OUR IMPACT

Wounded Warrior Project® (WWP) believes that no one organization can meet the needs of all wounded, injured, and ill veterans alone. Through collaboration with best-in-class military and veteran support organizations, we exist as a network of support for the warriors and families we serve. WWP invests in partner programs that enhance overall quality of life, reduce suicide risks, and support high-need post-9/11 veteran populations. Together, we amplify the effects of our collective efforts.

The impact highlighted reflects investments executed within WWP's 2023 fiscal year for programming through 2024. Unless otherwise stated, the impact highlights are of individual programs of partner organizations WWP invested in during this time period.



In addition to WWP providing direct programs and services for post-9/11 veterans and their families, we invested in 40 organizations that served 51,000+ service members, post-9/11 veterans, caregivers, family members, and children and impacted an additional 3,000+ pre-9/11 veterans and 10,000+ civilians primarily through connection opportunities.



Since 2012, WWP has partnered with and supported 215 organizations that provide the most impactful and essential services veterans, their families, and their caregivers need. This network of integrated support is vital to building strong, resilient veteran families and communities.

The Mission Based Trauma Recovery program engaged 955 veterans, family members, and caregivers, leading to veterans experiencing an 80% reduction

resilience. WWP is the proud co-chair, along with Elizabeth Dole Foundation, of the Hidden Helpers Coalition.

Additionally, 49 caregivers and family members received resources to help their families thrive.

55 INDIVIDUALS SUPPORTED

The Headway program supported 55 post-9/11 veterans, families, and caregivers with ntegration and therapeutic services. Offerings

community integration and therapeutic services. Offerings included day programs, family support, community outings, rehabilitation, and vocational training, boosting participants' Engagement in Meaningful Activities scores to 37. This represents a statistically significant increase of 26% after one year of program involvement.

* HOUSING INSECURITY AND THERAPEUTIC SERVICES



19,742 THERAPEUTIC COMMUNITY SERVICES

2,700 post-9/11 veterans received support through 19,742 Therapeutic Community model services, including mental and

behavioral health, substance abuse treatment, outreach, peer support, and skills development. As a result, 65% transitioned to permanent housing, with 91% of them maintaining it for more than seven months.

Supported six organizations that served more than 3,700 veterans, family members, caregivers, and transitioning active-duty service members of the Special Operations

Forces through transition workshops and immediate financial assistance, including whole health and wellness programs.
